1. NEW Lemforder ball joints – L and R are the same.



2. Old ball joints with the wheel on (left) and without the wheel (right)



3. We have to remove 3 screws from the upper control arm and one nut from the joint.



4. Then it's impossible to remove to old ball joint since it was pushed under a pressure. I didn't have a special kit for ball joint, so I had to use a little vise...:) In order to do so, I had to cut the thread.



Both parts cut and removed \rightarrow



5. Then just put the new ball joint and tighten the nut on the bottom.



6. Then put the ball joint into the upper control arm and tighten all 3 screws.



All work can be done in about 30 minutes, the only problem you might face is with removing the ball joint from the steering knuckle.
