- I figured out most of this by watching the infamous Jeep Youtube video that details a similar process but without MB parts. Apparently this engine was used in lots of applications.

This is the location of where the glow plug module SHOULD be, I forgot to take pictures until after I had already removed the old one. You can see the connector, unplugged and the three mounting bolts.

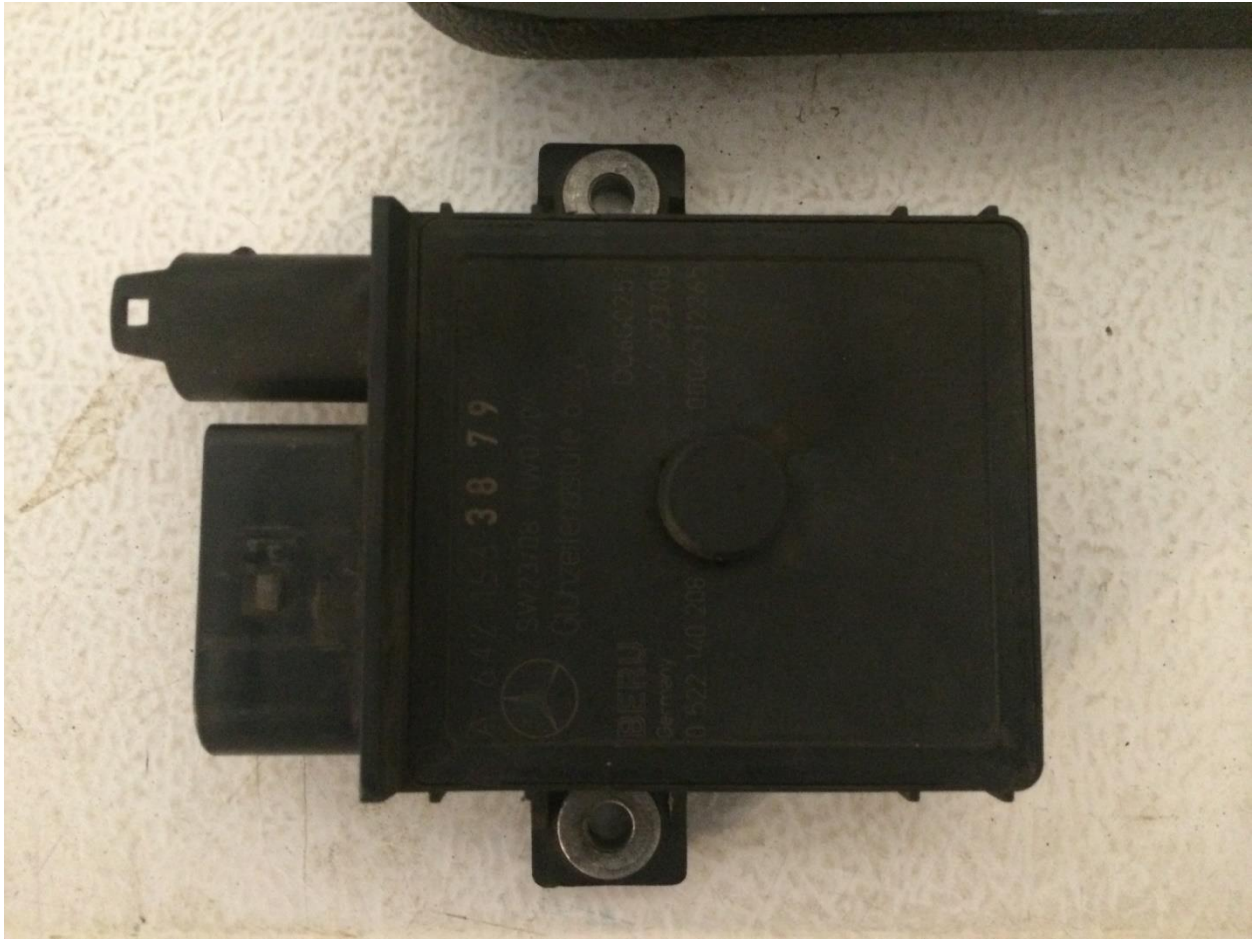


This is the bracket that sits above glow plug module and it holds some other cool stuff in place, you must remove it to get to the glow plug module.



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This is the old glow plug module after it has been removed and is no longer in the bracket. Note it is square and quite heavy. The part number is 642-153-38-79.

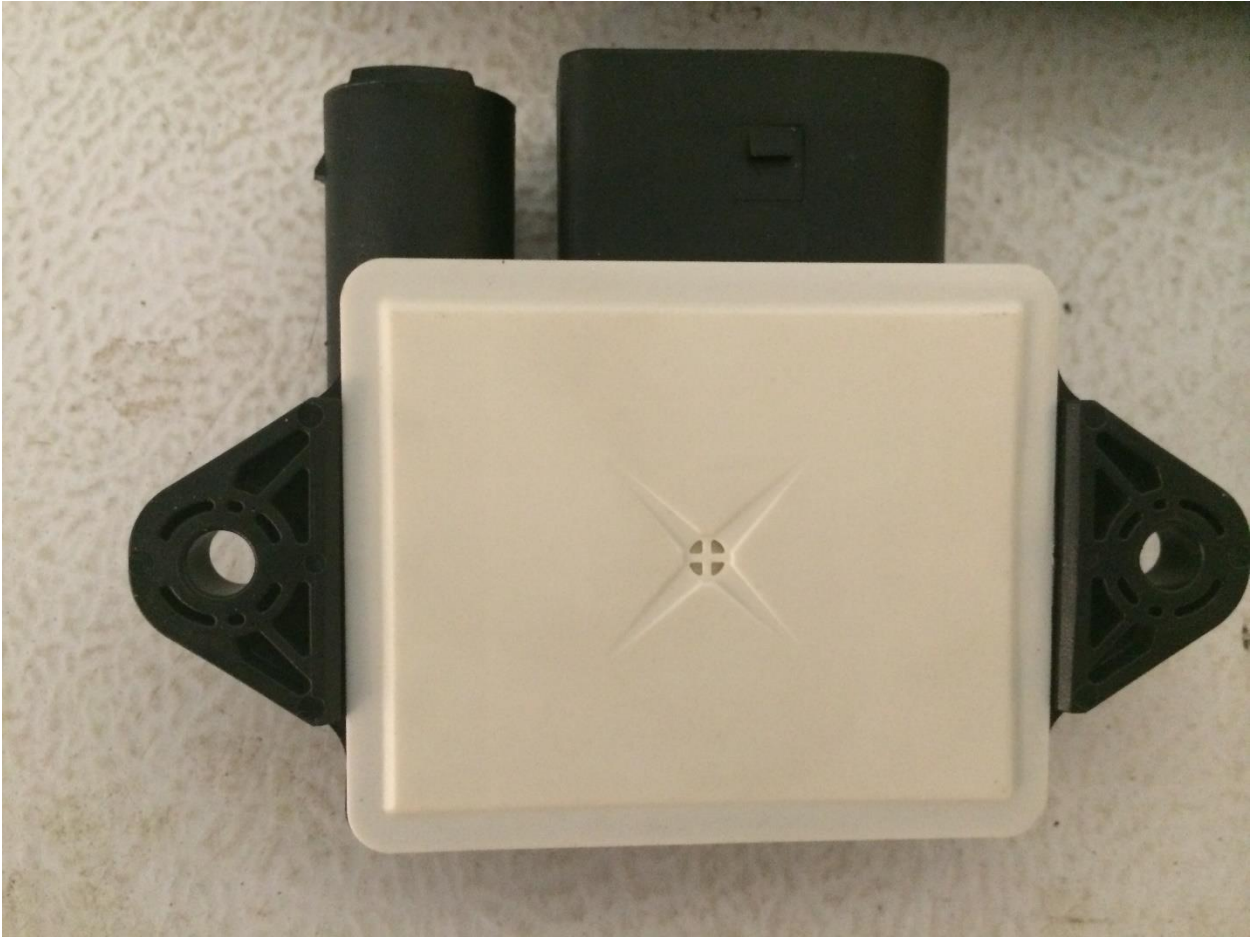




This is the new module, sorry for the blurry picture. Note that it is much lighter, and the same connector points, now only plastic, no metal reinforcements. The part number is 642-900-57-01. The part is so different, I wasn't sure it would actually fit.



The bottom of same part, but this time in focus.



This is how the new part fits into the same location as the old one. Note the plugs are in the same location, so all good.
